

20mph vs 30mph impact

- Being hit at 20mph is like falling from a 1st floor or into a trench of 3.6m
- Being hit at 30mph is like falling from a 3rd floor window or into a 8.8m trench
- => c.7x fatality risk for a pedestrian
- 1mph slower => 6% fewer collisions




Benefits of authority-wide 20mph

- **Economic**
 - Better for local business
 - 20%+ fewer casualties
 - Independent mobility for young and old
- **Social**
 - Sets the norm that 20's Plenty where people are
 - More walking and cycling is better for health
 - Stronger communities
- **Environmental**
 - Reduces pollution – 25% lower NOx
 - 50% less noise





LTN 1/20 – design guidance issued in 2020 prioritises Active Travel

Gear Change 1 year on – emphasises Walking and Cycling priorities

Active Travel England (January 2022): statutory consultee on all road schemes


New Highway Code: embeds existing best practice; helps vulnerable road users

Increased funding still not enough; 20mph is low hanging fruit

20mph complements New Highway Code(*)

- Hierarchy of responsibility
- People crossing side roads
- Lane positioning when cycling
- Overtaking distances
- Priorities at junctions
- 'Dutch Reach'

- Westerham, Otford, Speldhurst: village-wide
- Tunbridge Wells: 50% complete
- Canterbury: join up existing schemes
- Margate: seafront (Salmestone ward soon?)
- Whitstable and Herne Bay: extend area
- Hollingbourne, Chartham, Sandwich, Lenham, Yalding?
- Maidstone: lagging?
