Parish Update – Easter 2023 Maidstone – Helen Whately

Full steam ahead

After a March that's felt like forever, it looks like spring has finally sprung.

Looking back, it's no wonder it felt so long. I actually can't quite believe how much has been achieved in the four weeks since my last newsletter.

Back at the start of March we launched our plan to stop the boats, with new laws meaning that people who come here illegally won't be able to stay. It's absolutely right that we help people in need – but Britain should decide who meets the criteria, not people smugglers.

Then we had the Budget. After stabilising the economy in the Autumn, the Chancellor set out his plan for growth. He announced incentives for business investment, pension reforms to keep people in work for longer, and an expansion of free childcare to all children over 9 months old.

There was lots of good news for us locally too including tax cuts for pubs, £6 million for pothole repairs in Kent, and a fund for public swimming pools which I'm backing Faversham Pools' bid for!

He also extended the cap on people's energy bills to carry on supporting families and help bring inflation down. In fact, we've paid roughly half of the average household's energy bills this winter.

Clearly that can't go on forever, and that's why last week the Energy Secretary launched Powering Up Britain – our plan to create cheap, clean and abundant energy here in the UK.

It's not just here at home that we've been busy. During that time we've also struck a new deal with France, agreed a British submarine design for our defence partnership with Australia and the United States, and joined the CPTPP – our biggest trade deal since Brexit with 11 dynamic economies across the Indo-Pacific.

For my part, I've been working on historic reforms to the social care sector – giving care as a career the status is deserves and harnessing new tech to help people live independent lives for longer.

I've also been really busy locally too.

Every March I host an apprenticeship fair in Maidstone with other Kent MPs, and this year we had over 1,500 students from across Kent come and meet businesses from Amazon to Shepherd Neame.

It's always such a joy to see local students' eyes being opened to some of the brilliant opportunities out there.

I've also been sticking up for St Mary's Children's Centre in Faversham, and working to get flood defences with residents and local councillors.

The local elections coming up at the start of next month are your chance to have a say on who should be running things in your local area. Don't forget from this year you'll need photo ID to vote in person – and if you don't have one you can apply for one free by the 25th April.

And finally, seeing litter lying around locally is one of my absolute bugbears.

I want our local area to be looking its best for the Coronation at the start of May, and so I'm organising a constituency wide clean up the weekend before.

I'm calling on litter picking groups from across the constituency to help out, and I want as many people as possible to join in. If you'd like to get involved in any way, please email me at helen.whately.mp@parliament.uk

Maidstone Apprenticeship Fair bigger than ever!

Our Maidstone Apprenticeship Fair is always one of the highlights of my year. I host it with 6 of my Kent MP colleagues, and this year we had well over 1,500 students from 32 schools across Kent attending the fair, to meet nearly 70 employers.

Leaving school and entering the world of work is a big step in all of our lives. University can be a good option but it's far from the only one, and the more students know about what's out there, the better they can plan their future.

Winning Litter Angels poster takes pride of place

It's one of my biggest bugbears seeing litter lying around locally.

We live in such a beautiful part of the world, and seeing it spoiled by a thoughtless few is so disappointing. That's why each year I run a competition for local primary schools to design anti-littering posters, in partnership with the charity Litter Angels.

This year's winner was 9-year-old Dylan Hills, and his poster is now proudly on display across the Maidstone Services.

Along with educating people, we've got to make it harder to drop rubbish in the first place. That's why we recently announced a new wide-ranging ban on single-use plastics coming into force later this year.

Boost for buses and community transport

Getting around locally can be tough without a car. Not only are there fewer services, but they're often quite expensive too. With the current squeeze on household incomes a bus fare of £5 or more can put a real dent in your weekly budget.

That's why we're extending the £2 bus fare cap for another 3 months, and protecting vital bus services people rely on for work, school, and shopping.

Sadly with fewer people using buses we can't keep subsidising services forever, and I've also been successful in calling for more community transport funding to replace lost routes. Recently we heard the fantastic news that Faversham and the surrounding villages have been successful in their bid, along with schemes in Boughton Malherbe, and Bearsted & Detling.

Keeping us safe from flooding

Flooding can be an absolute disaster. There's no doubt that in recent years we've had more unpredictable weather, and a higher number of heavy downpours. Making sure our local flood defences stand up to the test is so important, I've been working with some of our brilliant councillors and local residents to get the upgrades that we need.

That includes in Headcorn, where after being alerted by a constituent to flooding on Grigg Lane I took the case up with Kent County Council who got the job done.

With joined up action and the right planning, we can keep flooding at bay.



Grafty Gourmet

This is a classic English dessert with an Italian twist. Another simple seasonal dish, that is great served with Vanilla Ice Cream.

Rhubarb With Amaretti Crumble

For the Filling:

400g of rhubarb, cut into 5cm pieces 1 large red eating apple (or 2 small), cut into chunks 5 tablespoons of maple syrup 4 tablespoons of demerara sugar, plus extra for sprinkling Finely grated zest of 1 orange ½ teaspoon of ground cinnamon 1 teaspoon of vanilla bean paste or vanilla extract

For the Amaretti Crumble:

110g of plain flour 75g of unsalted butter, cubed 50g of amaretti biscuits, crumbled 2 tablespoons of light muscovado sugar

1. Heat the oven to 190°C (170°C fan oven). Put the rhubarb, apple, maple syrup, demerara sugar, orange zest, cinnamon and vanilla in an oven proof dish.

2. In a separate bowl, rub together the plain flour and butter with your fingertips until it resembles breadcrumbs. Then stir in the amaretti and the light muscovado sugar.

3. Cover the fruit mixture evenly with the crumble mixture, then bake for 30 minutes or until the fruit is juicy and bubbling and the top is golden. Before serving, sprinkle over extra demerara sugar for crunch. Serve with Vanilla Ice Cream.





Anniversary

My anniversary for **May is 23rd**, the date of the death for Gerog Schumann in 1952. No known relation to the earlier famous Robert Schumann, Georg was



born at Königstein in Prussia. He was the son of Clemens Schumann (1839–1918) and the older brother of Camillo Schumann. He first studied the violin and organ with his father and grandfather, and was taught by Friedrich Baumfelder, a well-known German composer, pianist, and conductor of his day. He later was a student at the Leipzig Conservatory for seven years, conducted an orchestra at Danzig from 1891–1896 and from 1896-1899 the orchestra at Bremen. In 1900 he became professor and director at the Sing-Akademie zu Berlin. In 1907 he became a member of the Prussian Academy of Arts, in 1918 vice-president and finally in 1934 President.

As well as two Symphonies he composed and published a wide ramge of orchestral works, chamber music and piano music but never received the international acclaim of his namesake.
